### **MoE / NIHERST help build the nation's resilience in education transformation**

**Port-of-Spain, Trinidad and Tobago.** The Ministry of Education's Adopt-a-School programme received thirty (30) chrome books sponsored by NIHERST.

The Adopt-A-School programme was built on the premise of creating a long-term meaningful partnership that would provide schools with vital resources and networks to facilitate the establishment of long-term philanthropic relationships.

At the most recent Adopt-a-School presentation ceremony held on August 25th, 2022, St. David's. R.C. Primary School, a member of the NIHERST Teach ME Project (Increasing **Teachers** Confidence for **My Education**) was the beneficiary.

The Teach ME project aims to measurably improve levels of creativity in the delivery and learning of STEM subjects in Trinidad and Tobago. This is achieved by supplementing existing methods and techniques used in teaching at primary and secondary schools through hands-on/minds-on methods and techniques to adequately prepare our young people for the exciting world of Science, Technology, and Innovation.

Speaking at the Adopt-a-School presentation ceremony, NIHERST Governor, Ms. Sharon Baboolal, underscored the need for digital technology adoption and expressed that 'students are

no longer required to merely equip themselves with the physical pages of their textbooks, but e-learning competencies and associated technologies are now ever more essential.'

Present at the ceremony, Honourable Minister, Dr. Nyan Gadsby-Dolly in her address asked the audience, "Why are we still distributing laptops. Have schools not fully reopened?".

In her reflection of the effects brought on by the pandemic and echoing the sentiments expressed by the NIHERST Governor, she answered by stating that, "it is imperative that we build an education system that is resilient enough to withstand a shock that could not have been contemplated pre-2020, but we know is possible in 2022 and beyond".

The Honourable Minister continued her address by impressing on the audience, 'the only way we know that is possible is to ensure that our students can be in school whether they are physically there or virtually present, so the need for us to move our education system online is paramount.'

Also in attendance was Ms. Ginnall Thomas, Principal (Ag.) of St. David's R.C Primary School, who expressed her deepest gratitude to both the Ministry of Education and NIHERST for the initiative.

The ceremony was also attended by Mrs. Marleen Lord-Lewis (NIHERST President), Ms. Ryane Rollock, (V.P, Science and Technology (Ag.)), Mrs. Giselle Dinzey (Ast.
